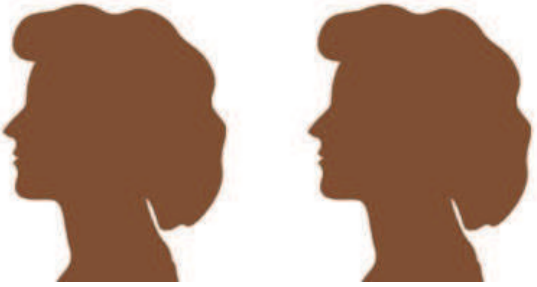


EVELYN DeHONIESTO
