After raising her children, Kathleen embarked on a career as a teller for Dollar Bank in Monroeville, later moving to Mellon Bank in Turtle Creek. In her late fifties, following the loss of her beloved husband Jim, Kathleen discovered a passion for art. She used her grief as a catalyst, turning to the canvas to capture the historical images of the Turtle Creek Valley, including her beloved hometown of Turtle Creek, and also Wilmerding, East Pittsburgh, Braddock, North Braddock, Kennywood and the city of Pittsburgh. Her vibrant, nostalgic portrayals, even though an untrained artist, sparked memories for all who viewed her work, earning her the affectionate title of "The Grandma Moses of Pittsburgh". She became very accomplished as an artist and won many awards and blue ribbons at varied art shows. Kathleen's talent was recognized by many, with her art being purchased by Teresa Heinz and also being displayed at prestigious locations such as Nemacolin and The Rivers of Steel Museum in Homestead. But her creativity did not stop at her colorful painting. Kathleen was also a storyteller, preserving the history of Turtle Creek and its valley neighbors through her written and spoken words. She compiled pages of memories that depicted true events, places, and people, and she frequently volunteered as a local history teacher and served as a docent at the former Westinghouse Museum in Wilmerding. Remembered for her thoughtful nature, Kathleen's legacy extends beyond her artwork and historical contributions. Her friendly spirit and creative soul touched everyone she met, leaving an indelible mark on the community she loved so dearly. Her memory will continue to inspire, and her art will serve as a vivid reminder of a woman who used her talents to capture and share the beauty of her world. Kathleen will be deeply missed by her loving family, friends, and all who were fortunate enough to know her.
