He was influential in the Filipino community in Pittsburgh, serving as President of the Samahang Pilipino Ng Pittsburgh (which later became the Filipino American Association of Pittsburgh), was a big supporter of the Philippine American Performing Arts of Greater Pittsburgh (where his granddaughters danced), and was also active with the Philippine American Medical Society of Western PA. His charitable work also extended to serving on the board of Brother's Brother Foundation, and he was proud to be able to deliver a state-of-the-art ambulance to rural Philippines. He loved to travel, traipsing around the world with his beloved Lou.

Most of all, he was a proud grandfather who would drive everywhere to watch his granddaughters' many activities and sports events, once driving 6 hours from Philadelphia to watch a dance recital for 3½ minutes then driving back to Philadelphia. He was beloved by all who met him because of his endless Dad jokes, funny stories, and obsession with hats, outhouses, and anything Marilyn Monroe.
