Bernice peacefully departed this Earth on August 3, 2023. surrounded by family. She didn't just leave as Bernice, but departed as beloved mother, grandmother, greatgrandmother, Big Red, Mrs. A, Teta, Bebo, and Aunt Bernie. Most of all, she departed deeply loved by the many that knew her.

Widowed by her husband of 62 years in 2014, Mrs. Asmonga was born in Duquesne, Pennsylvania in 1930, the daughter of Daniel and Anna Staisey, and sister to The Honorable Leonard Staisey (Emilie) and George Staisey (Donna), all of whom preceded her in death. She is survived by six children: Mary Asmonga Knapp of Battle Creek, Michigan; Ásmonga Ciaccia Cathy of Uniontown.
