Throughout his 28 years of operating Archi-Dec, "Mr. L" took under his mentorship several young men and trained them in all aspects of the floorcovering business...many of them went on to use this training in their life's work...along with the work ethic gained from his example.

Leon had the highest work ethic, passed on from his father, Leo...who followed the "Old Polish Proverb" – In order to be successful, all you have to do is work half days – 9 to 9... and then you have the other half day to mess around. around.
