Formerly of Pittsburgh, passed away on Monday August 7, 2023. She is survived by her loving husband Robert Chute. She was predeceased by her parents, Robert Francis Beech, Mary Louda; and her adored cousin, Melva Jean Holmstrom, who raised Suzanne since she was six years old; and by her precious step-children: Myanna Chute and Rob Cabot Chute.

In 1990 with her career behind her Suzanne focused on personal interests, managing and maintaining homes she and her husband owned in Pittsburgh, PA, Naples, Fl; Newport, RI; Bay Harbor, Michigan; Boston, Ma; and Manhattan, NY.

She and Bob lived in Naples, Florida for 30 years. They traveled extensively and enjoyed visiting Cathedrals and dining all over the world. Suzanne enjoyed cooking, Farmers Markets, long walks, Historical fiction and playing the piano.

As in her younger years, she became involved in fundraising. She served on the Immokalee Foundation Board, chairing the Patron committee and several others for Youth Haven, David Lawrence Foundation, Southwest Florida Conservation, & St. Ann School.

She founded the Magnolia Ball and along with friends in the community raised millions of dollars for Naples Community Hospital Cancer Education and Endowment fund.

For several years, Suzanne and her husband, Bob were trustees of the Naples Wine Festival/Naples Children & Education donating and hosting Vintner dinners helping to raise funds for the underserved in Collier County.

Eventually the Chutes preferred to having one residence, choosing New York where Suzanne was a member of FIT Couture Council, Central Park Women's Committee and continued her support for medical research at NY Presby Columbia and MSKCC.
