Sealed proposals will be received by the Borough of Dormont Stormwater Authority, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania through the Quest Construction Data Network (QuestCDN) at www.questcdn.com until 11:00 AM prevailing time on October 11, 2023 for:

CONTRACT NO. 23-SW1 PIEDMONT STORMWATER IMPROVEMENTS

The scope of work includes the storm sewer improvements from the intersection of Scott Road northeast along Eastmont Avenue to the intersection of Peermont Avenue, from the intersection of Latonia Avenue along 9th Alley to intersection of Eastmont Avenue including approximately 820 linear feet of new storm sewers; 15 inlets, roadway restoration, traffic control; one alternate for additional storm sewer infrastructure, and all necessary appurtenances for said construction. All bidders are required to buy the Bid Documents in PDF format for a non-refundable deposit of \$150.00 from QuestCDN using project number 8562226. Any technical questions regarding the bid documents are to be directed to LSSE. The project is being financed, in part, by the Allegheny County Economic Development via a Gaming Economic Development Tourism Fund (GEDTF) Grant and a Commonwealth Finance Authority Local Share Account (LSA) Grant. Bidder agrees to comply with all requirements of both grants. Compliance is required with the Pennsylvania Prevailing Wage Act of 1961, P.L. 987, No. 442; Title VI and other applicable provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; the Department of Labor Equal Opportunity Clause (41 CFR 60 -1.4); Executive Order 11625 (Utilization of minority Business Enterprise); Executive Order 12138 (Utilization of Female Business Enterprise); in compliance with Section 504 of Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; the Allegheny County MBE/WBE Program enacted July 1981, which sets forth goals of 13 percent Minority and 2 percent Female Business Enterprise; and the Allegheny County Ordinance #6867-12, setting forth goals of 5 percent Veteran Owned Small Businesses. Pennsylvania prevailing wage rates apply if over \$25,000.00. Proposals must be upon the forms furnished by the Authority. The bid must be accompanied by a certified check or bid bond in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the bid, made payable to the Borough of Dormont Stormwater Authority to guarantee the bidder's entrance into the contract if given the award. The Authority reserves the right to reject any or all proposals and to waive any informalities in the bidding. No bid may be withdrawn for ninety (90) calendar days after the scheduled time for receipt of bids.

Attention is directed to the fact that procurement is subject to all requirements of the Pennsylvania "Steel Products Procurement Act, Act No. 1978-3"; and for Contract value exceeding \$25,000, the Pennsylvania Prevailing Wage Act (Act of 1961 P.L. 987), and The Public Works Employment Verification Act (July 2012) apply. The Authority shall (a) award the construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder therefore, or (b) reject all bids received within ninety (90) days of the date of bid opening; provided, however, that the Authority may, in its sole discretion, delay such award or rejection for up to one hundred twenty (120) days from the bid opening date until the Authority has received all required approvals from other governmental agencies. Bidders on this work will be required to comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.
