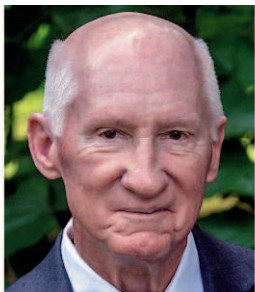


## GARY W PFLUGH
