His rich singing voice brought a warmth to the camp sing-a-longs that outmatched the warmth of the campfire and he was always welcome in the church choir. He also often assisted in writing newsletters and making programs for church or community events and served as a deacon of the Bern Reformed United Church of Christ, in Leesport, PA. In recent years, Bob tutored English as a second language with Pittsburgh Library.
