Of Upper St. Clair, PA (formerly of McMurray), passed away on September 8, 2023, after a lengthy illness. John was born in Gastonville, PA on December 9, 1938, to Henry and Nora (Wallace) Holzapfel. He attended Monongahela High School and continued his education at Penn State University. John graduated from Penn State in 1960 with a degree in Business Administration and began his

professional career with Coopers and Lybrand (now Price Waterhouse Coopers), where he became a Certified Public Accountant in 1963 and was welcomed as a partner in 1972. John was an active member of the Pennsylvania Institute of CPAs and served as president of the Pittsburgh chapter of the National Association of Accountants.
