And she and Regis became the proud parents of Mary Ellen Collins of St. Petersburg, FL (John); Carol of Shadyside, Kevin of Highland Park (Carlie); and Susan of Shadyside, Evelyn juggled marriage, motherhood, and work with ease and patience, and taught her children by example: "do your best, be on time, use good grammar, and write thank you notes!"

She created a warm and welcoming home for her family and all of their friends, and when she said, "the door is always open" and "there's always room for one more," she meant it. Thanks to her culinary talents, countless friends, colleagues, and neighbors considered 319 Edgewood Avenue a favorite spot for a meal, a snack, or a cup of coffee at any time of the day. She wanted to make sure no one ever left her house hungry. In many ways, Evelyn became "everybody's mother," sharing her wisdom and wide range of practical knowledge. She taught people the fine art of canning fruits and vegetables; and served as a source of advice on everything from child rearing to medical problems, and even, once, what to do if there's a bear in the yard. Evelyn was an accomplished professional, and her colleagues' respect led to her receiving the 1984 Frist Humanitarian Award from United Community Hospital (formerly Grove City Hospital). The award, named for the CEO of the Hospital Corporation of America, recognized Evelyn as a "responsive and responsible leader and a first class lady" who was dedicated to her patients as well as her staff, and always willing to go out of her way to help others.
