Ira Franklin Clifford, affectionately known as "Rocky," was called home on October 3, 2023 at UPMC Montefiore, with his sister and best friend, Nancy, by his side. Rock was born April 11, 1948 at McKeesport Hospital. He was the son of the late Sarah Alice Thomas Clifford and the late Luther Franklin Clifford. "Rock" grew up in Old Rainey, where he attended Southmoreland High School. After graduating from
