Notice is hereby given that separate and sealed proposals will be received by the Borough of Homestead, East Seventh Street, Homestead, PA 15120, until 11:00 AM, prevailing time, on Tuesday, November 14, 2023 and opened and read immediately thereafter for the following project:

This project consists primarily of the Borings and Right of Way Crossings under Penn D.O.T. Right of Way (East Eighth Avenue) and under the combined Rights of Ways of Norfolk-Southern Corporation and CSX Railroad all within McClure Street, in the Borough of Homestead.

Each proposal shall be accompanied by a Bidder's Bond, Cashier's Check, or Certified Check in favor of the Borough of Homestead in the amount of not less than ten percent (10%) of the amount of the proposal, as evidence the bidder will accept and carry out the conditions of the contract in case of award.

"Compliance is required with the Pennsylvania Prevailing Wage Act of 1961 P.L. 987, No. 442; Title VI and other applicable provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; the Department of Labor Equal Opportunity Clause (41 CFR 60 - 1.4); Executive Order 11625 (Utilization of Minority Business Enterprise); Executive Order 12138 (Utilization of Female Business Enterprise); in compliance with Section 504 of Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; the Allegheny County MBE/WBE Program enacted July, 1981, which sets forth goals of 13 percent Minority and 2 percent Female Business Enterprise; and the Allegheny County Ordinance #6867-12, setting forth goals of 5 percent Veteran Owned Small Businesses."

No bid may be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days once filed with the Borough of Homestead. The Borough of Homestead reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive any informality in the bids received.
