John Andrew Sutyak, 71, summoned to join God in His Kingdom on October 17, 2023. It was a quiet, blissful departure, occurring while on a grand tour of Hawaii. He was the proud son of Michael and Magdalen Sutyak, Pittsburgh, PA; with siblings: Keith, Gregory, James, and Cynthia. John was the ultimate sportsman. He was an all-star goalie in the PAHL, and worked out with the Pittsburgh Knights. At North Allegheny High School, he garnered the sobriquet "Sudsy," lettering in baseball. He was an avid golfer carrying a single digit handicap and also enjoyed skiing and scuba diving. In his later years, he played bridge, earning master points. John graduated from Ohio University with a BS in Electrical Engineering and an MBA in Finance. He launched his professional career at Westinghouse Generator Division. Ultimately, he built his career legacy at Voith Hydro and Weir American Hydro, where he specialized in governors and controls for hydroelectric turbines. His work, as a field engineer, brought him to power plants around the world. In 1991, he traveled to Taiwan to work on the Mingtan Power Plant, which became the largest pumped-storage hydroelectric plant in Asia upon completion. It was there that he met his wife, Ann, who he married in 1993. Eventually, they settled down in York, PA and raised two daughters, Joann and Diane. John was an American patriot who whole-heartedly supported the principles of truth, justice, life and liberty. He is survived by his wife, daughters, siblings, and eight nieces and nephews.
