Her most cherished times were spent vacationing with her husband on Martha's Vineyard, Nags Head, and Amelia Island. She also was an annual participant and prolific fundraiser for the Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure. Carol was a devoted and loving wife for 59 years to John H. "Jack" Wolf. (John H. Wolf passed away on October 28, 2023.) Carol is survived by her children Linda R.
