Jack Widmer, 65, lifelong resident of Lower Burrell, died at home in the presence of his family on Friday, November 17, 2023. Born John Charles Widmer in New Kensington to the late Charles (Dutch) Widmer and Marie (Prengaman) Widmer, Jack grew up in Lower Burrell and was a 1976 graduate of Burrell High School. Following four years of service in the United States Coast Guard, Jack returned to his

hometown where he ultimately began a 27-year career as a rural letter carrier for the U.S. Postal Service, retiring in 2018.

A true "Jack-of-all-trades," there wasn't a topic with which Jack wasn't familiar. On any given weekday, Jack enjoyed beating the contestants and his wife and sons at Jeopardy. Jack took
