Sister Joan served as Archdiocesan Schools Supervisor and Assistant Superintendent of elementary and high schools in San Juan, Puerto Rico. In 1971, Sister Joan returned to Pittsburgh to become the principal of Boyle High School. In addition to education, Sister Joan served as an admissions counselor at Carlow University from 1982-1986. Before her retirement, Sister Joan worked at Mercy Hospital managing volunteer services, as director of the Seven Sisters gift shop, and on special projects.
