LaVonne died peacefully, surrounded by loving family, at Avow Hospice in Naples, Florida, on November 28, 2023, following a brief hospitalization. She was 91 years old. LaVonne was a lifelong learner and an avid reader, often enjoying several books at once. She loved to grow orchids and to watch the birds outside her window. She had an extraordinary sense of style and design, which was reflected in the award-winning garden landscape at her Marco Island home. She will be missed by her big black cat, "Tommy." Paramount in her life was her Lutheran faith, her family, and her many dear friends. She adored her grandchildren and

great-grandchildren beyond measure.
