Martin (Marty) Lieb, 85, of Masonic Village, Sewickley, formerly of Monroeville and Bucks County, PA, passed away peacefully on Monday, December 11, 2023. He was born in Philadelphia, PA, on September 15, 1938, to the late George and Margaret Lieb. He led work groups with Habitat for Humanity and he helped local food pantries. His unforgettable voice had a soothing nature which led him to volunteer for Contact Pittsburgh, a suicide hotline. He also narrated many books for the Carnegie Library for the Blind. Both he and Alice were members of the First Unitarian Church of Pittsburgh.
