Euripides (Rip) was born

His parents were diligent farmers of modest means who instilled values of hard work, faith, and family to their eleven children. Overcoming significant odds, Euripides arrived in the United States in September 1949 and enrolled in Genevea College in Beaver Falls, PA earning a degree in industrial engineering. On July 6, 1953, he married the bell of Chester, PA, Mary. He was hired by Nabisco Inc. where he worked for 33 years. He retired from the Pittsburgh factory in 1986. While working and raising a family, Euripides helped establish the Cyprus Society of Greater Philadelphia where he served as the first elected secretary.

After 30 years of faithful service to the community of Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Cathedral (Oakland), he was ordained a deacon by His Eminence Metropolitan Maximos in 1995 and served as deacon to the late Fr. Sarantos Serviou. In 2011, His Eminence Metropolitan Savas elevated him to Archdeacon, a tremendous honor. His final service was to Saint Thomas Greek Orthodox Church in Cherry Hill, NJ as deacon to Fr. Emmanuel Pratsinakis. He spent his final decade in Medford, NJ under the loving care and attention of
