The Reverend Dr. James K. Smith, Sr., of Whitehall, entered into eternal rest on December 31, 2023. He was the son of the late Mayor James K. K. Smith and Charlotte Stevenson Smith of Dormont. Born in 1936, he was 87 at the time of his death. He was the husband of Lynne Smith; father of James K. Smith Jr. of Uniontown, Donald A. Smith (Lori) of Butler, Robert S.
