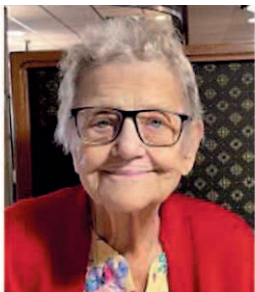


JANET JEAN (KURAN) NOGAL
