It is with heavy hearts that we announce the passing of Steven Shreve, who departed this world on January 6, 2024. He left us peacefully, surrounded by loved ones.

Steve was born on December 12, 1966, in Philippi, WV and was the son of William Holmes Shreve and Nellie (James) Shreve. He grew up in Elkins, WV and attended Ohio University and then New York University, where he earned his law

degree. Steve's career in law was dedicated to helping others dealing with difficult circumstances.

A lengthy illness took Steve away from us far too soon, leaving a void that can never be filled. He will be remembered for his kindness, intelligence, sense of humor, and his impact on the lives of those fortunate enough to have known him.

His love of nature and wildlife were exemplified by his own backyard bird and animal sanctuary. Steve cherished his role as a parent and leaves behind a legacy of love, guidance, and precious memories with his beloved children. Steve is also survived by siblings, Tim Shreve (Becky), Mary Alice Shreve (TJ), Sophie Demchik (Michael), Patricia Shreve (Rob); nephew, Jason Collett (with whom he had a special bond); and a multitude of extended family and friends. Steve was preceded in death by his parents; and siblings, Sue Isner and Bill Shreve.
