Natalie moved to the North Side of Pittsburgh along with her parents and sisters when she was 13. She attended Allegheny High School and was a drum majorette in the band. She attended a school dance where she met a dashing US Army Air Corps Sergeant, Robert Casey. She asked him if he had a penny and got his heart in return. Marriage would wait for three years when Natalie entered the Nursing program at St. John's Hospital on Pittsburgh's North Side as the rules of the day prohibited married women from being in the program. Upon graduation, Natalie married Bob and Bob often said "nine months and five minutes" later their first child was born to be followed by three more over the next

few years.

Natalie worked as a nurse for over 60 years, starting at St.
John's Hospital before moving to St. Clair Hospital and then
Passavant Hospital when it opened. Natalie embodied what
it meant to be a nurse, as she truly cared for her patients
and spent time getting to know them as people. She worked
at Passavant for over 40 years until her retirement. Natalie is
remembered as one of the last of the nurses to wear a
nurse's can while on duty.

Natalie's other love after Bob, her family, and nursing was the theater. She performed for decades with the St Teresa players, visiting senior centers and nursing homes, often to audiences younger than her. She served as an usher at Heinz Hall, The Byham, and The Benedum for years.
