Joseph Forrest Carter, 74, died unexpectedly on Tuesday, January 30, 2024, in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He was born April 6, 1949, in Pittsburgh to the late Kathleen Maguire Carter and John Marshall Carter, MD, of Huntington, West Virginia. Joe graduated from St. Joseph Central Catholic High School, Huntington, in 1968. He attended St. Leo University, St. Leo, Florida and St. Vincent College, Latrobe,
