She was a member of the First Congregational Church of Windsor, where she served on countless committees, including two pastoral search committees. Finally, she was the driving force behind the creation of the SummerWind Performing Arts Center in Windsor, and was proud to get her first business card, at the age of 73, with the title of "Founder & Board Member".

Jane leaves her children Christopher Goodale of South Yarmouth, MA, Stephen Goodale of Mission Viejo, CA, Anne Goodale Allen (Steven) of Pittsburgh, PA, and Andrew Goodale (Cheryl Cummins) of Fernandina Beach, FL. She is also survived by her grandchildren Jennifer Goodale Botchway (Charles), Reed Goodale, Kelley Goodale, Laura Kemerer Byington (Dustin), and Adam Kemerer (Maggie Tennis), her great-grandchildren Aden, Findley, and Miles Botchway, and her sister-in-law Jeanne Campbell (Jack Cowling).
