He and his wife, Eleonore, enjoyed traveling abroad, especially to Eastern Europe. Other hobbies included square dancing and an occasional golf game.

Bernie is survived by his beloved wife of 66 years, Eleonore Kawa Palowitch; five children, Bernard L., Jr. of Raleigh, NC, Andrew W. of Arlington, VA, Victoria Nashwinter of Fairfax, VA, Carl J. of Pleasanton, CA, and Casimir J. of Medford, OR; 11 grandchildren; seven great-grandchildren; and one brother, Thomas J. of Palm Coast, FL.
