As an officer of the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers, Gregg was involved in the emergency response efforts for the North Ridge Earthquake as well as Hurricanes Andrew and Katrina. Gregg served overseas in Germany, the Balkans, Kuwait, Uzbekistan, and Afghanistan, managing

large military construction projects.

After retiring from the Army, Gregg was proud to teach chemistry to engineering students at the University of Pittsburgh. At the time of his passing, Gregg was looking forward to receiving a liver transplant so that he could spend more quality time with his family, cook, garden, sing, bust out "Walk of Life" jazz dance moves, and inquire about a job at the VA to work with other veterans. Gregg was preceded in death by his father; and his sister, Terrylynne Blake. He is survived by his mother; his devoted wife, Ericka Marie (Cederstrom) Huston; his children, Carrie Attaway (Travis) of Uniontown, Gregg C.
