

## PAUL EDWARD LEGO



Paul Edward Lego died peacefully in Naples, FL, on February 23, 2024, at the age of 93, after a long battle with congestive heart failure. Paul was born on May 16th, 1930, in Sandy Ridge, PA, the son of Paul Irvin and Sara (Montgomery) Lego. Paul graduated from Conemaugh High School in 1948, where he was class president and quarterback of the football team. After his distinguished military service as a Master

Sergeant in the US Army during the Korean War, including a Distinguished Service Medal, Paul earned both a bachelor's and master's degree in electrical engineering from the University of Pittsburgh. Paul joined the Westinghouse Electric Corporation in 1956 and spent his entire career there in various engineering, management, and executive positions. In 1975, Paul was awarded the Westinghouse Order of Merit, the highest honor the Corporation bestows on an employee. In 1990, he was elected Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation.

Paul retired from Westinghouse in 1993, after 37 years with the company. Paul also served on the boards of directors of the USX Corporation, PNC Bank Corp, Lincoln Electric, Commonwealth Industries (Aleris), and the Consolidated Natural Gas Company. He was a member of The Business Council and the American Society of Corporate Executives, a member of the board of overseers of the New Jersey Institute of Technology, a Trustee of the University of Pittsburgh, and chairman of its board of visitors for the School of Engineering. During his career, Paul met with several U.S. Presidents, foreign dignitaries, astronauts, and famous athletes, and dined at the White House several times. Shortly after his army service, Paul met the love of his life, Ann Sepety, at a square dance, and successfully passed the scrutiny of her mother and many brothers. Paul and Ann married on July 7th, 1956, and were partners for 61 years before her death in 2018. Paul was a devoted husband and missed her deeply after her passing. Together, Paul and Ann had four children and six grandchildren.

In the little spare time that he had beyond his career and family, Paul was an avid golfer. He played golf with some of the sport's most famous athletes including Arnold Palmer, Johnny Miller, and Ray Floyd, and played some of the world's greatest courses including Augusta, the Old Course at St Andrews, and Pebble Beach in the AT&T ProAm in 1993. Paul actively played golf into his 90s and boasted that he shot under his age over 100 times.

In addition to his parents, and his wife Ann, Paul was predeceased by his sister, Kathleen. He is survived by his sisters, Peggy, Darlene, and Sherry; his sons, Paul Gregory (Kimberly), Douglas Edward (Rhonda), and Michael John (Wendy); and his daughter, Debra Ann, as well as by his grandchildren, Paul Henry, Tori, Dylan, Cassidy, Caroline, and Bryan.

Visitation/Vigil will be from 5 pm to 8 pm on Thursday, February 29th at **BEINHAUER FUNERAL HOME** on Route 19 in Upper St. Clair. A Mass of Christian Burial will be held at 10 a.m. Friday, March 1st at Resurrection Parish (St. Thomas More Catholic Church), in Upper Saint Clair, PA.
