Our dear mother, Ruthe (that's right, with an 'e'), was fourth child and daughter born to Anna Fega Rabinowitz. David from Skvira, immigrants Ukraine, in Pittsburgh's District. Moving to Nicholson Street in Squirrel Hill when she was a girl, Ruthe was a gradŭaťe Taylor of Allderdice High School. She helped produce her graduating variety show for its twentieth hosting reunion,

During high school, she assisted her parents by working in her father's grocery store, Dave's Market on Penn Avenue, and 25th Street in the Strip District. As the kids grew into teen years she worked in retail (Millers women's fashions in the then new South Hills Village), in sales of office equipment and supplies (Leslie Dresbold), and later taught Yoga at the Bigelow Health Club.

One by one, her kids moved to California. Ruthe eventually followed suit in 1982, relocating to Marin County nearest to her youngest son, Michael. Ruthe's entrepreneurial skills led through various occupations, culminating as the er/operator of "Day at the Bay", a successful inbound owner/operator of "Day at the Bay", entertainment enterprise offering tour and San Francisco Bay cruises and luncheons in great settings, with entertainment billed as "A Musical Stroll Down Broadway", which she produced, directed and in which she performed. Her flair for entertainment, showmanship, and her business acumen kept her busy with that activity well into her eighties. She also worked in hotel sales and marketing and directed activities at some Bay Area assisted living facilities.

Ruthe had a passion for sharing her knowledge of life skills

and self-care with her family, friends, and even acquaintances. She moved into assisted living herself in her later years and passed away peacefully at age 96.
