Dave also liked to tell stories of his childhood. Their car rides with the boys when they were young always led to Dave's detailed explanation of his life in York, PA, with his

family.

When a grandson finally entered his life at age 72, he spent many hours caring for and playing trains with Wyatt. Thus began a new host of "Wyatt stories". They were best friends!
