

# JACK THURN



Jack Thurn, of Richmond VA, a longtime resident of Level Green, Pennsylvania, passed away March 3, 2024, at the age of 94. Jack was a beloved husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather, and friend to many. He was preceded in death by his wife of 61 years, Marilyn Schenck Thurn; and brothers, Walter H. Thurn and Robert Thurn. He was survived by daughters, Luanne Thurn Kolleda of Richmond, VA, and

Following his military service, Jack worked for BAR Development, driving heavy equipment for a successful developer of commercial and residential real estate in the Pittsburgh area until his retirement. Jack was an active member of Trinity Lutheran Church in Pitcairn, eventually becoming a long-time member of Level Green United Presbyterian Church. Nature photography was his passion, taking thousands of photographs and many movies over the last 75 years. After retirement, Jack and Marilyn traveled throughout the US and Europe, often visiting their daughters and their families. Jack was always positive about his long, healthy life and how "lucky" he had been in his lifetime.
