

In the case of Mount v Du Carme, FD-22-009055-007, a Complaint in Divorce under §3301(c) of the Divorce Code was filed on October 31, 2022, and served upon Defendant on January 5th, 2023 via Publication per Order of Court dated December 15th, 2022. The marriage of plaintiff and defendant is irretrievably broken, and ninety days have elapsed from the date of filing and service of the Complaint. Defendant, Victor David Du Carme is hereby noticed that an entry of a final decree of divorce after service of Notice of Intention to File Praecipe to Transmit Record shall be made in March 2024. This notice serves to document Mr. Du Carme's consent with the entry of a final decree of divorce without notice and that he may lose rights concerning alimony, division of property, lawyer's fees or expenses if he does not claim them before a divorce is granted; and that he shall not be divorced until a decree has been entered by the Court of Common Pleas of Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, and that a copy shall be sent to his last known address after it is filed with the prothonotary. This publication constitutes the Affidavit of Consent and the Waiver of Notice of Intention to Request Entry of a Divorce Decree under §3301(c) of the Pennsylvania Divorce Code.
