

LEROY RED STRIMEL



LeRoy "Red" Strimel age 84, of Canonsburg, passed away peacefully Friday, March 8, 2024, in his home. He was born October 3, 1939, in Cecil, a son of the late George and Gertrude Rudge Strimel. Red was a graduate of Cecil High School class of 1957 and proudly served with the Pennsylvania Army National Guard. He had been employed as a Psych Aid and in Security at the former Woodville State Hospital in

Bridgeville until its closing in 1992. Red lived most of his life in Cecil and moved to Canonsburg in 2006. He was a member of the Bears Club in Meadowlands, the Muse Independent Club, VFW Post 191 of Canonsburg, and the American Legion Post 902 in Houston.
