Jean Anne Pelusi passed away peacefully at UPMC Passavant Hospital surrounded by her immediate family who were at her side, early Sunday, March 10, 2024. She was born April 19, 1928, in Streetsboro/Ravenna, Ohio, the youngest of two children (the late, Jack Kohl, her brother), who were both raised by two incredibly loving parents (the late Art and Ethel Kohl). She had been a resident at Sherwood Oaks

Nursing Home for more than 10 years. She attended Ravenna High School, and then went on to Nursing School and later became a full-time nurse and then later a part-time nurse at St. Elizabeth Hospital in Youngstown, Ohio.
