
JOHN "JACK" HALL

Jack was an avid Motorcycle rider and was recognized as a "Legend in Motorcycling" by the Keystone Motorcycle Press. He traveled the United States by motorcycle, owned more than one hundred bikes, built dozens of choppers and ran a few parts stores. Most would recognize Hall's Motorcycle Parts and Accessories which was located on Route 8. While most people knew him from the motorcycle community, many may not know how creative and artistic he was. He spent a lot of time crafting beautiful wood carvings and painting statues, with his most prized statues being the Eagles he displayed outside of his home. Jack has said numerous times that he lived a great life.
