
## **WILLIAM P. "BILL" JONES**

After the war ended, Bill returned to the Pittsburgh area and enrolled at the University of Pittsburgh. Upon completion of his science program at Pitt, he was employed by Harbison-Walker Refractories (Dresser Industries). Bill began as a warehouse manager but quickly rose through the ranks to become the senior refractories sales representative on the East Coast. During his tenure, he obtained at least four patents related to ceramic engineering.

He was a life-long athlete enjoying everything from figure skating to tennis and golf. He was an avid reader, musician,

naturalist, amateur astronomer, and novelist.
