In 1963, he and his wife, Marjorie Kass got married, moved to Palm Beach Gardens, bought a house, and raised two children. John went to work for The Miami Herald until he retired. He cared for his stroke victim wife for 22 years until his family cared for him for the final 2 1/2 years of his life. He is survived by his wife, Marjorie; son and daughter, Nicholas and Pamela; granddaughter, Leeanne; and sisters, Madge and Susie.
