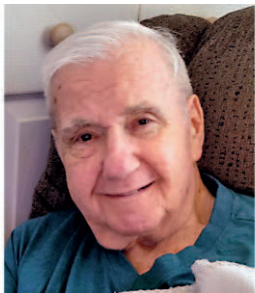


CHARLES M. LUCCI, SR.
