She and her sisters enjoyed local renown in the 1960's as the "Foerster Girls" helping politician Tom Foerster campaign. In 1964, she married the dashing Ed Kelly the day after Christmas (She told her daughters they picked the date to save on flowers for the wedding Mass.) Following Ed's career, she and her young family moved to Lake in the Hills, Illinois. She lived there the rest of her life making annual visits to Pittsburgh to visit the

McGuire clan. Kate lit up the room when she walked in. You wouldn't forget meeting her. She was the life of the party, a fierce advocate, and a friend who never gave up. She fostered a unique relationship with each of her 15 grandchildren. She

was magnificent.

After retiring as a teacher at Hough Elementary School, Kate circled the world taking turns visiting her daughters and grandchildren in Ireland, Alaska, and Australia. She reeled in Alaskan cabin, danced with Russian soldiers on a walrus-skin boat tour of the Kamchatka Peninsula, charmed the fellows in Irish pubs, trekked through Tasmania and worked out on the Australian beach at sunrise.

In between travels, she treasured her home and life in Lake in the Hills where she nurtured her enormous gardens, hosted barbeques on the lake, walked with friends in the fen, drank coffee with the Bagel Boys and treasured her book and garden club meetings. She loved spending time with her eldest daughter Kerry and her family, and sister Karen in Elgin where she was a fixture at neighborhood get-togethers.

She never really grew old. People were often astounded when they learned her age. She died a few months shy of
