She served as President of the Council's Board of Directors. The Smiths were also founding donors of the August Wilson African American Cultural Center in Pittsburgh.

Patsy is survived by her three children, Anne B. Hulley (Northampton, MA), Emily B. Naunheim (O'Fallon, IL) and Robert L. Becker, III (New York, NY and Cornwall, CT); four step-children from her second marriage, Pamela Stodolsky, Wallace W. Smith, III (Ladan), Sarah Smith (Robert Davidson) and Steuart Smith (Dana); eight grandchildren, Nathan Hulley, Emily Hulley Keating, Elizabeth Hulley Sukhovskaya, Timothy Hulley, James Hulley, Anastasia Hulley Sandoval, Mariya Hulley and Margaret Naunheim Grubb; fourteen greatgrandchildren; two sons-in-law predeceased her, David A.
