

Early Notice and Public Review of a Proposed Activity in a 100-Year Floodplain

To: All interested Agencies, Groups, and Individuals

This is to give notice that Allegheny County has determined that the following proposed action under the Community Development Block Grant Program is located in the 100-year floodplain and Allegheny County will be identifying and evaluating practicable alternatives to location the action in the floodplain and the potential impacts on the floodplain from the proposed action, as required by Executive Order 11988, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands.

FY23 Glenn Ave Embankment: This project involves embankment restoration in Liberty Borough and Port Vue Borough on Glenn Avenue between River Ridge Road and Liberty Way. Work will include guardrail removal, roadway stabilization, erosion prevention, saw cutting, street milling, asphalt paving, and wedge curb installation. This action involves less than one acre located in a 100-year floodplain A Zone (area of special flood hazard without base flood elevation or depth) per FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) Panel 42003C0503H, effective 9/26/2014.

FY23 Verona Borough Demolition 204 West Railroad Ave: This project involves the demolition of the dilapidated structure located at 204 West Railroad Avenue, Verona, PA 15147. This action involves less than an acre in a 100-year floodplain A Zone (area of special flood hazard without base flood elevation or depth) per FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) Panel 42003C0376H, effective on 9/26/2014.

There are three primary purposes for this notice: First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Commenters are encouraged to offer alternative sites outside of the floodplain, alternative methods to serve the same project purpose, and methods to minimize and mitigate impacts. Second, adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information and request for public comment about floodplains can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks and impacts associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.
