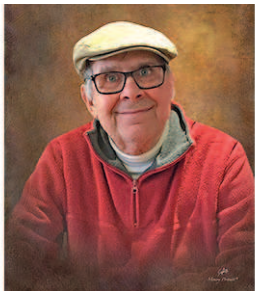


DAVID J. HORN, SR.
