

WALTER MEDWID



Age 91, of Latrobe, passed away on Sunday, April 21, 2024, at the Lutheran Senior Life Passavant Community, Zelienople.

Born March 23, 1933, in Downingtown, PA, he was a son of the late John Medwid and Eugenia (Rubinowicz) Medwid.
