I seek out, without intentionally realizing it, people who

are interesting and stimulating.

Pat's desire to expand into new areas and experience new things led to her involvement as a board member or serving in other leadership positions with these and other groups: Mercer County Land Preservation Board, League of Women Voters (Mercer County and State level), Women's Interfaith Council of the Shenango Valley, Life Long Learning Council of Sharon, Great Decisions Sunday School discussion leader, First Presbyterian Church Choir, Meals on Wheels, Transfer Area Farmers Club, Mercer County United Way Sharon and Sharon General Hospital Auxiliary.

Her desire to expand her experiences also involved travel. A lot of travel. She and Sam traveled throughout the U.S. and

visited six of the seven continents.

She is survived by her husband of almost 67 years, Dr. Samuel George Woodings; her brother, James Cowan; her four daughters, Rebecca, Lisa, Catherine and Elizabeth; her son-in-law, Bruce Goodman; and her grandson, Phillip.
