Ken was born on November 28, 1947 in Pittsburgh, PA to Wilma "Sis" Daschbach Hubenthal and Kenneth George Hubenthal, Sr. and passed away on May 28, 2024.

Ken was a 1965 graduate of Saint Michael High School, Pittsburgh, PA.
