Fran was predeceased by her brothers William and Leonard Bornyek, her second husband-Robert (RJ) Brant, and her beloved grandson, Lorenzo Pane. In addition to her daughters and life partner, Fran is survived by her cherished grandchildren Hannah Kraut (28), Nicholas Kraut (23), and Francesca Pane (16) and brother, George Bornyek.

Fran's positive outlook on life was inspirational, especially in light of the losses she faced. "We're so lucky" was her

mantra with her family.
