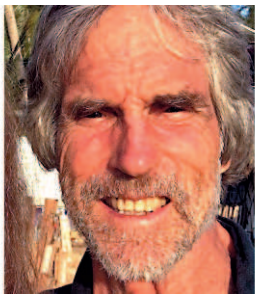


GREGG J. WEIS

He was devout in his Christian faith and was a member of the Crosspointe Church in Pittsburgh, PA.
