

# MARY VIRGINIA (SIMPSON) KISTLER



Age 90, at Providence Point, formerly of Mt. Lebanon, passed away on July 17, 2024. Mary was born and raised in Mt. Lebanon. She graduated from Mt. Lebanon High School in the class of 1951. It was there that she met her husband of 68 years, Drew.

Mary graduated from Stephens College with an AA degree, then transferred to Syracuse University to complete her education,

Favorite travels included an African safari and touring Israel and Jordan, especially the Petra site. Each trip was always a special event in her life. She loved gardening and always enjoyed working in her flower gardens, which she planted at her home in Providence Point.

Mary's very favorite activity was needlepoint. She loved stitching beautiful pillows, handbags, belts, eyeglass holders, and hundreds of Christmas ornaments for family members and friends.

Mary's faith was strong. She attended St. Anne Catholic Church in Castle Shannon weekly for more than 55 years.

Mary leaves behind her twin daughters, Sharon Kistler and Ginger Bean (Stuart); daughter-in-law, Jamie Kistler; grandchildren, Andrew and Morgan Bean, Douglas and Sarah DeNunzio, and Brittany Dill (Norman); and great-grandsons, Aiden and Lucas Dill.
