Alvernia from 1998-2019. Sister Therese continued her liturgical ministry when the Sisters of St. Francis moved to The Waters of Wexford in 2019. Sister Therese shared her guidelines for living a long life: be positive, be around young people, keep on learning, and play and enjoy music in your life. She did them all, and her love of music permeated her very being. She sang the song of her life as a family member, a Franciscan Sister and friend to all. Her life was a symphony of praise to God and all creation. We thank God for the many ways she inspired us all to sing and celebrate the music of our lives.
